

Rooster Tails Ocean Trip—Oct. 26, 2017

A total of 20 fishermen made the trip on the Tigerfish out of Emeryville. The boat is 50' long and had good accommodations. We fished in the vicinity of the Farallon Islands. From the boat dock to the fishing grounds was about a three hour boat ride out to the Islands and then the same back to the dock. The weather was very good with light wind and not too much swell. All 20 fishermen got the ten fish rock cod limit and there were about ten Lingcod caught on the boat. Whales were spotted while fishing. Most of the rock cod were caught on shrimp flies tipped with a small piece of squid. Some Lingcod were also caught on shrimp flies as well as jig bars or on whole dead sardines. The boat would move to other nearby spots when the bite lessened. All in all a very good trip with another one planned for 2018.

Chanel—The Psycic Universe— *continued*
